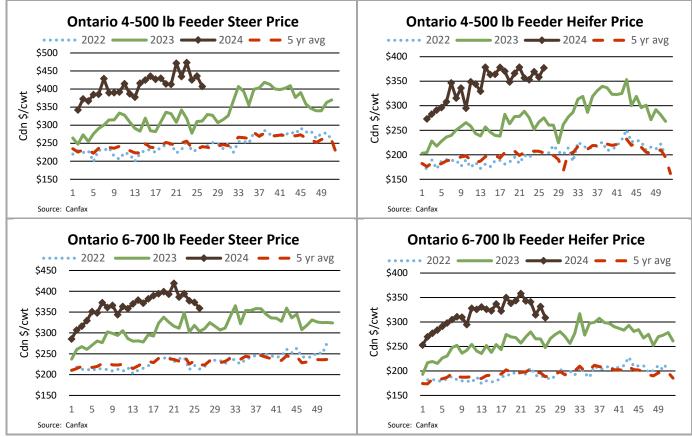

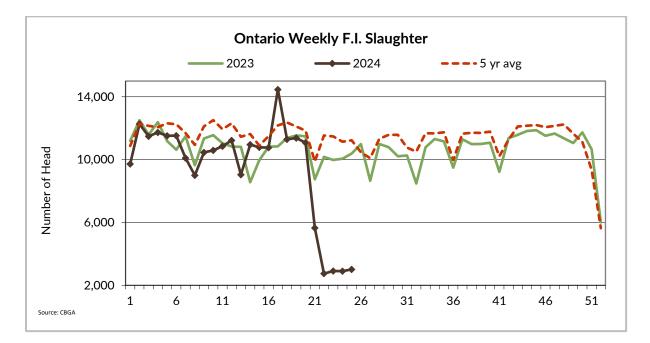

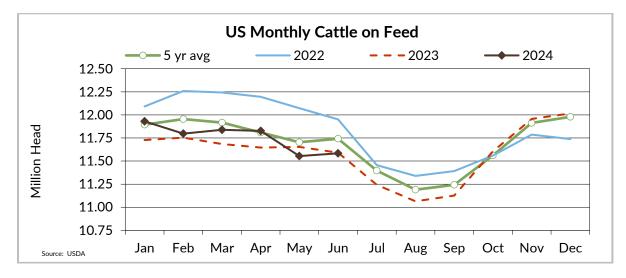

Comments for the week ending June 27, 2024

Fed steers and heifers sold through auction markets this week at 559 head, were up 394 head from the previous week and 100 head larger than the same time last year. Fed steers sold from \$223.44-\$239.09/cwt averaging \$231.41, up \$7.50 cwt from the previous week's trade but \$6.09 below year ago prices. Fed heifers sold from \$223.46-\$242.74 averaging \$232.43 cwt, down \$0.88 from last week and \$3.98 lower than last year. Auction markets reported fed steers and heifers sold steady with good buyer demand.

In Ontario, business remains quiet. Late trade last week was at \$415/cwt dressed (\$252/cwt live). Eastern exports of fed cattle and cows to the US for week ending June 15th at 4,662 head were up 2,662 head from last year and 2.4 times the five-year average for the same week. Export receipts of processing cattle have moved counter-seasonally larger since the first week of May and are expected to stay large. On June 27th, CBC reported that Cargill and the workers union have agreed to meet next week in an effort to end the five-week-old strike.

Cull cow receipts sold through auction markets this week were 1,746 head, up 57 head from last week but down 264 head from last year. Cows were selling from \$129.57-\$176.56/cwt averaging \$151.57/cwt, up \$2.36/cwt from last week and up \$29.92 from last year. Auction markets reported cows sold actively at \$5.00-6.00 higher prices. Beef cow prices sold from \$136.59-\$188.75/cwt averaging \$162.34, down \$2.04 cwt from the previous week's trade but \$27.39 above year ago prices.

Receipts of 2,087 stocker and feeder cattle sold through Ontario auction markets this week down 440 head from the previous week and 1,315 head fewer than the same week last year. Auction markets last week reported stockers sold at firm prices. This week, feeder steers sold at higher prices, and stockers continued at strong prices. Actual average prices collected this week saw steers from 400-500 lbs trading \$28.89 cwt lower than last week on average, 500-600 lbs down \$0.92, 600-700 lbs down \$14.06, 700-800 lbs down \$17.37, 800-900 lbs were up \$15.05, steers 900-1000 lbs down \$3.34 and steers 1000 lbs plus averaged \$0.04 cwt stronger than the previous week's weighted average prices. Heifers from 300-400 lbs were up

\$2.34 cwt from last week on average, 400-500 lbs up \$19.03, 500-600 lbs down \$9.09, 600-700 lbs down \$22.64, 700-800 lbs down \$9.12, 800-900 lbs down \$14.13 and heifers 900 lbs and over averaged \$8.89 cwt weaker than the previous week's weighted average prices.

The Quebec electronic market this week sold at \$399.75-\$400.00cwt dressed on a picked-up basis, which is down \$2.95 from the previous week's trade on average.

Alberta fed trade was active last week, with prices \$2.50-3.00/cwt lower than the previous week. All three packers were active on fed market. Last week, cull cows through Alberta commercial auction marts eased around \$2/cwt lower. This week, heavier carcass weights continue to support production. Steer carcass weights in the West for the week ending June 14th, 2024, averaged 890 lbs, 37 lbs heavier than the same week last year. Canfax reports: "Deferred live cattle futures were somewhat mixed on Monday following USDA's June 1st cattle on feed report. Midweek Alberta fed prices were steady to \$5/cwt lower than last week. Delivery is reported at mostly three weeks out. All three packers were active this week."

The U.S. cash cattle trade last week was delayed until Friday afternoon. Dressed sales in the Northern feeding states ranged from \$308-312/cwt, while live sales have been reported from \$197-198/cwt. This week, USDA released their weekly crop progress report on Monday June 24th. Conditions deteriorated slightly, with corn acreage rated good or excellent at 69%, down from 72% the previous week. Boxed beef prices continue to be supported; Choice was at \$323.80/cwt at midday. On the Fed Cattle Exchange, three lots of heifers traded Bid the Grid at \$193/cwt on June 26th, and two steer/heifer mixed lots sold at \$195/cwt Bid the Grid on June 27th.

The US Cattle on Feed Report came out last Friday afternoon and it should be viewed as negative. Feedlot placements for the month of May at +4% not only exceeded average estimates of -2%; but came in above top end estimates of +2.4%. Higher US cash prices might support near-by live cattle contracts but look for pressure on deferred months. Canfax reported: "Based on the five-year average, it is not uncommon to see cattle on feed inventories increase from May to June and this was the case this year. Survey fed cattle marketings for May were slightly above last year and 2% larger than the three-year average. In May, feedlot placements totaled 2.05 million head the largest monthly receipt seen this year. Feedlot placements were historically low in April and rebounded sharply in May. May feedlot placements were 4% larger than last year with gains noted across all weight categories."
